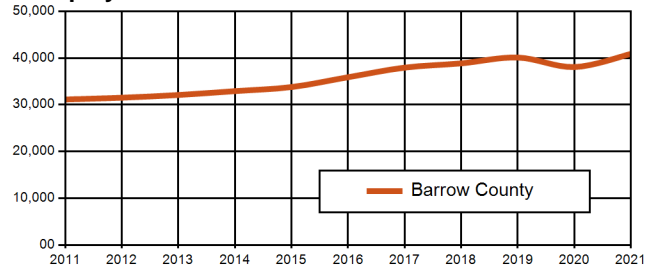

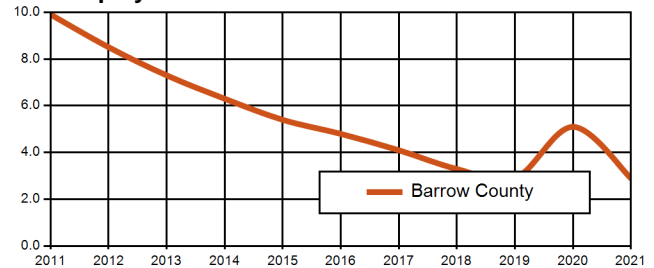

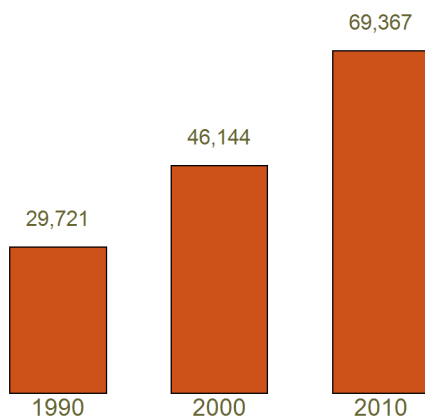

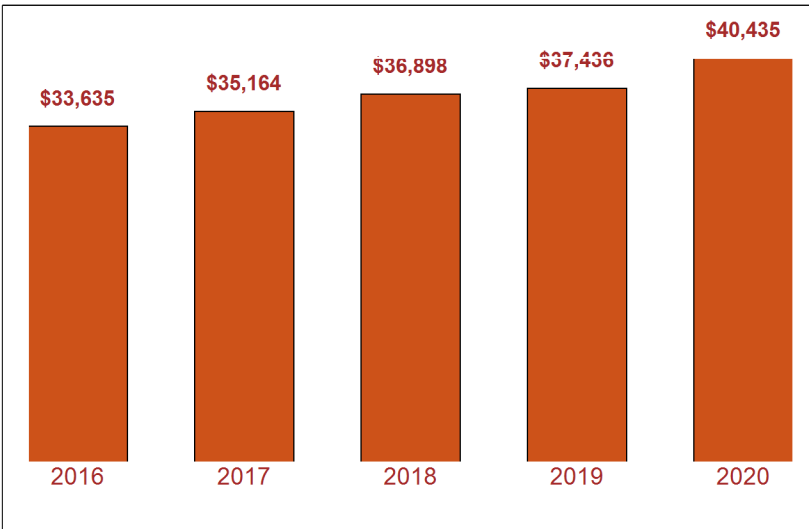

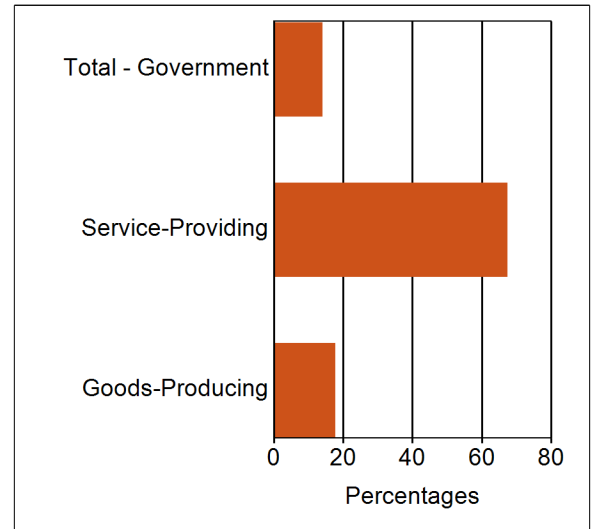
Barrow Per Capita Income
